We welcome submissions in three categories:

- 1. Paper/Research Presentations (20 minutes + 10-minute Q&A)
- **2.** Clinical Demonstrations (1 hour)
- 3. Poster Presentations

Submissions may address, but are not limited to, the following topics:

- Cross-cultural competencies in sex therapy
- Indigenous and non-Western sexual health paradigms
- Clinical adaptations for marginalized or underserved populations
- Spirituality, religion, and sexuality in therapeutic contexts
- Ethical frameworks for culturally responsive sex therapy
- International comparisons of sexual health education and policy
- Therapeutic case studies and outcome research from diverse communities

Submissions must include the following:

- Presentation type (Paper Presentation, Clinical Demonstration, or Poster)
- Title of your submission
- Abstract (maximum **300 words**, in English)
- Full name(s), institutional affiliation(s), and email address(es) of all authors/presenters
- A short professional biography (**100 words or fewer per contributor**)

Please note: Submissions sent via email will not be accepted. All proposals must be submitted through the online portal to be considered.

### **Important Dates:**

- Abstract Submission Deadline: January 5, 2026
- Notification of Acceptance: January 20, 2026
- Pre-Symposium Draft of Full Paper Due: April 18, 2026
- Final Paper Submission (Post-Conference Edits): June 15, 2026

Please note: **Final papers are only required for those submitting paper presentations** and accepted for publication. Failure to submit the final paper by June 15 will disqualify the paper from the publication.

#### **Publication Opportunities**

- A selection of papers will be published in the 2026 annual ISST volume with Cambridge Scholars Publishing.
- All accepted abstracts (if presented at the symposium) will be published in the International Journal of Psychosexual Therapy.
- Not all presentations will be included in the book; publication is **selective** and based on academic rigor and fit with the volume.

#### **Important Note**

This year's symposium is **fully in-person**. Due to current technical limitations, **no virtual or hybrid presentations** will be accepted.
